

Ivan Franko National University of Lviv





Founded on January 20, 1661 when King John II Casimir of Poland issued the diploma granting the city's Jesuit Collegium "the honour of the academy and the title of the university".





- Lviv - city in Western Ukraine
- Dates back to 1256
- Was built by King Danylo and named after his son - Prince Lev (Leo).



The university is named after Ivan Franko (1856-1916) - the famous Ukrainian poet, writer, literary critic, and political activist.
